## Abstract

The German Research Foundation (DFG) supports international cooperation in all funded projects and devotes particular attention to the education and advancement of early career researchers. International Research Training Groups (IRTGs) funded by DFG combine these two objectives by putting a key emphasis on the qualification of doctoral researchers within the framework of a focused research program jointly organized by two partner universities.

The Research Training Group funding program is celebrating its 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year. This presentation is going to introduce the success story of IRTGs and give insights in the strategic development over time.
