

TEMPORARY RESIDENT VISA (TRV)


Temporary Resident Visa is also known as a Visitor Visa, a counterfoil, or a visa, issued to foreign nationals from <u>visa-required countries</u>.

- It proves you meet the requirements to travel to Canada but it does not guarantee entry into Canada.
- The expiry date on your TRV is the last date you can use to travel to Canada. It does **not** indicate the date by which you must leave.
- If you hold a study permit or work permit, TRV **usually** expires on the same date as your permit expires.
- You don't need a valid visa to stay in Canada.

STUDY PERMIT

Study Permit authorizes you to **study and stay** in Canada.

- May include specific conditions that may authorize you to work on- and/or off-campus.
- Usually valid for the period of your academic program plus 90 days.
- If you need to study longer, you can apply for an extension of your Study Permit from within Canada.



ELECTRONIC TRAVEL AUTHORIZATION (ETA)

An eTA is an entry document issued to citizens of visa-exempt countries.

- Is electronically linked to a traveller's passport.
- Is required to travel to and re-enter Canada.
- Valid for up to 5 years or until the foreign national's passport expires, whichever comes first.
- You need to get a new eTA if you get a new passport.

Note: U.S. citizens and lawful permanent residents of the US do not require TRVs or eTAs.

WHEN TO APPLY FOR A VISA

- You can apply for a visa from inside Canada if
 - your study permit or work permit is valid for longer than your visa, and
 - you need to travel soon, but your visa has expired or will expire before your return to Canada
- You don't need to apply for a visa if you are not planning to travel outside
 Canada. Apply in advance if you are unsure.
- You cannot return to Canada without a valid visa. You can apply for a visa from outside Canada.
- If you apply for a study permit or work permit from **outside Canada**, IRCC will automatically issue a visa upon approval. No separate visa application is needed.
